Mark lettered in basketball his sophomore, junior and senior years. One of the purist shooters ever to don the Blue and White enabled Mark to reach the 1000 point plateau. He was the first player to ever do so in Muncy basketball history. Mark finished his career with 1323 points. He scored his career high of 44 points in a game against Hughesville.

Mark lettered his sophomore and junior years in football and played wide receiver. He also participated on the volleyball team which won Districts and competed at the State Tournament. He also was on the track team.

Mark's knowledge of basketball, discipline and excellent attitude led him to the coaching ranks. He began his coaching career at Wheeler High School in Marietta, Ga. where he directed the basketball program for 7 years. During the last four seasons Miller's teams posted a 74-30 record. His 1991 team advanced to the quarter-finals of the Georgia class AAAA State Championships. Twelve of his former players went on to sign scholarships. Mark then coached one year at Tennessee Temple University under Rick Burby, before coaching at Division I, Liberty University for three seasons under Jeff Meyer. In 1994 Liberty won the Big South Conference and played in a March Madness. (The Big Dance) When asked what has been his motivation in coaching, Miller responded, "Since I've accepted the Lord, my motivation now is to help develop and challenge young people while striving to be a consistent, positive Christian testimony."
