Max lettered three years in football. He played quarterback and led the Indians to their only undefeated season in its gridiron history. The key in winning the West Branch title in 1954 was Max's accuracy through the air as he completed 64% of his passes. Max lettered two years in basketball. His senior year he played point guard and helped his team post an 18-5 record and a berth in the District IV play-offs. He averaged 11 points per game.

Max lettered three years in baseball. His senior year he was the lead off hitter and played shortstop. The Indians won the West Branch Championship his senior year as he led the team in hitting. Muncy finished with a 12-1 record as its only loss came in the District IV finals.

Max attended Lock Haven State Teachers College where he played football and baseball. An injury prevented him from continuing his football career, but he played baseball for the remaining three years and was co-captain his senior year.

After his graduation in 1959 he was a teacher at Central Fulton High School in McConnellsburg, Pa. for 15 years. He coached varsity basketball for 13 years and his teams won over 160 games. He also coached baseball for 7 years and soccer for one.
