

Muncy High School Athletic Hall of Fame John "Tootie" Rohm Class of 1951 Induction year 2006

Tootie was one of the best all-around aathletes ever to don the blue and white at Muncy High School. Tootie earned 11 varsity letters for the Indians only surpassed by Cork Egli. He lettered four years each in football and baseball and three years in wrestling. Tootie utilized his blazing speed in fooball and baseball. In football he played the halfback position while also running the option pass play many times by connecting with end Richard Van Buskirk, Tootie Co-captained the Indians his senior year. In baseball Tootie was a natural lead off hitter and a centerfielder. After high school baseball he played West Branch baseball before playing 25 stellar years of fast pitch softball for the perennial powerhouse Sprout-Waldron in the Industrial League. Tootie also wrestled three years and was a key performer for the Indians in the middleweight classes.

Tootie was a dedicated Christian and witness to many of his love for the Lord.
